

# **Coronavirus and Food Establishments**

## Information for Food Establishment Permit Holders and Persons-in-Charge

#### What is Coronavirus?

Coronavirus disease 2019 (also called COVID-19) is a respiratory illness first detected in Wuhan, China, that is spreading from person-to-person contact. Typically, respiratory viruses are most contagious when an individual is most symptomatic, but other individuals may have very mild symptoms.

#### How it Spreads/ Symptoms

- The virus primarily spreads via respiratory droplets produced when an infected person sneezes or coughs.
- It spreads between people who are in close contact (within about 6 feet).
- Symptoms may appear in as few as 2 days to as long as 14 days after exposure and consist of: fever, cough and/or shortness of breath.

#### **Prevention**

- Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Clean and sanitize objects and surfaces that have been touched (counters, doorknobs, toilets, etc.)
- Cover nose and mouth when coughing and sneezing with a tissue, then immediately dispose of tissue and wash hands for at least 20 seconds.
- The Division of Public Health and the CDC do not recommend the routine use of respirators (facemasks).
- Stay home if sick.

### <u>Monitoring</u>

- To keep employees and customers safe, it is highly recommended to exclude any employees who are showing flu-like symptoms in general, and screen all employees for COVID-19 using three basic screening questions:
  - 1. Symptoms such as fever, cough, or shortness of breath?
  - 2. Travel to China, South Korea, Italy, Iran or Japan in past 14 days?
  - 3. Exposure to anyone with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the last 14 days?
- To keep employees and customers safe, if a customer shows flu like symptoms in the restaurant:
  - 1. Provide the customer additional napkins or tissues.
  - 2. Make sure alcohol-based sanitizer is available for customers to use.
  - 3. Be sure to clean and sanitize any objects or surfaces that may have been touched.
